EMSL Associate Director Honored for Engineering Achievement

EMSL Associate Director Gordon Anderson was honored with the 2005 Pacific Northwest National Laboratory (PNNL) Director's award for engineering achievement.

Anderson, who received the award in a special ceremony held in October, was honored for his influential contributions in the field of data acquisition and data management systems, as applied to proteomics and systems biology informatics. His many contributions include leading an eight-member team that manages data produced by in-house and visiting researchers using 15 state-of-the-art instruments in EMSL's High-Performance Mass Spectrometry Facility—an effort that has resulted in the archival of more than 200-million different spectra.



This honor is the newest in a long succession of prestigious awards received by Anderson during his illustrious 20-year career at PNNL. Other recent honors include two R&D 100 Awards, a Federal Laboratory Consortium Award for Technology Transfer, the 2003 Systems Engineer of the Year by the International Council on Systems Engineering, and several patents.

The Laboratory Director's awards program was established in early 2005 to honor staff whose research brings PNNL recognition as an institution where world-class science and technology is conducted. Anderson was one of five recipients who received the Laboratory Director's award in a variety of categories. EMSL users Dick Smith and Yong Wang received the lifetime achievement and scientific achievement awards, respectively.
